75% of FSA families say their social supports from family, friends, neighbors, and communities have increased. 88% of FSA families deal with daily problems more effectively since joining FSA.

As one FSA parent recently shared: ***“This community has changed because people are now aware of what kind of programs are out there. For me, things have improved by working with FSA because before I wouldn’t speak my mind, but now I can express my concerns and I know that my Navigator can help me bring this to the attention of others.”***




